# ANNE GHALEY SECRETARY



How long have you been a part of ISHSA?

I have been with ISHSA since the beginning. I was privileged to be part of the group that saw ISHSA go from a discussion around the table to a thriving organization we have today.

What got you started in horses?

I grew up in North Dakota on a farm that used work horses for a time. My dad bought a pony for me when I was a toddler & encouraged my riding. I went to a country school with grades I thru 8 where I rode my horse to school. When it was time to go to college, I chose one close to home so I could come home on the weekend. Mom said I came to see my horse.

What is your favorite class?

My favorite class is trail & In hand trail. We started our animals at a day old going over logs & progressed to more obstacles as they aged. I think it is good for all animals to do a variety of things. We train all around horses.

If you could give one piece of advice to someone who is thinking about and/or pursuing showing horses, what would it be?

I would encourage anyone to pursue showing horses, it teaches a discipline needed for life. You learn that hard work pays off, you learn there are winners & losers. Hopefully you learn to be a gracious winner & if you lose to be the type of person to look at the winners for advice & a role model. Take seriously what you learn & enjoy it. Life is a journey, enjoy it every step of the way.

In my later years I have given lessons to family, 4–H kids & others. I love to share my knowledge. I helped start the ISHSA judging clinic way back when. I wanted to share the knowledge I had gained by going to the Color Breed judging seminar in OK City. This was an opportunity to share with our young people & bring opportunities to them. This also benefited ISHSA because we are one of the few organizations with an umbrella over all breeds. Judging an ISHSA show is indeed a challenge.

My late husband Mel & I had judging cards from both Buckskin Association, IBHA & ABHA, both miniature associations AMHA & AMHR, POA & Am Mule Association. Having these judging cards led to many adventures in places all over the US. We are truly thankful for all the opportunities the equine world has given us.

Horses I have raised & shown: All of the animals we have shown & made champions were born & raised on our place, with the exception of two paint horses we bought as weanlings from the Paint Pitch Fork ranch in Colorado. They were Verses Dandy (stallion) Pitch Pride( mare)

We made APHA champions out of these two animals & they became the source of many of the all around horses we had the pleasure of training & showing.

I am no longer showing but I have shown several animals. The last two were Willy Be A Dandy, a big brown & white gelding. He loved showing in the arena where people were around. He did not enjoy trail riding outside of an arena. Freckles a red & white mare with a mind of her own.
